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#### European Public Health Alliance

**EPHA** is an international non-profit association registered in Belgium. <u>Our membership</u> is composed of not-for-profit organisations working on all aspects of public health.

EPHA's mission is to promote and protect the health of all people living in Europe and to advocate for greater participation of citizens in health-related policy making at the European level.

#### Membership benefits

What will EPHA membership provide?

#### Information on health issues and EU policy developments :

- ▶ <u>An Electronic Newsletter</u>. On a monthly basis a newsletter is sent by e-mail. Regular features include recent EU policy developments, secretariat activities, members' activities and forthcoming events on public health related issues.
- ▶ **Health Alerts**. Short alerts are sent to members via e-mail whenever an important development on health-related EU policy takes place.
- Members Only' section of Website. Apart from the information available to the general public on EPHA's website, members have access to internal policy and strategy information on website pages, which are accessible only with a membership password.
- ▶ **Newslists**. Special briefings on particular subjects of interest to a certain group of members are provided via an electronic mailing list.
- Daily information help desk.

#### **Communication among EPHA members:**

- ▶ Special Interest Group and Working Groups. At present there are two Special Interest Groups (SIG) on Health Determinants and Health Systems. Each SIG meets twice a year and convenes ad-hoc working groups for more focussed discussions. In 2009, the active working groups are: Alcohol, Food and Nutrition, Health professionals, Healthcare, Pharmaceuticals and eHealth. These groups can be set up following members' requests or at the suggestion of the secretariat.
- ▶ **Policy Co-ordination Group**. Monthly meeting in Brussels, open to all EPHA members. Contributions to the meeting are also received via e-mail. The aim of these meetings is to share

information, discuss EU health policy developments and create policy positions and strategies for EPHA and its members. The minutes of these meetings are available on the "members only" section of the EPHA website.

Seminars and training sessions organised by EPHA.

### Visibility in EU policy making circles:

▶ EPHA website. Given its extensive use among those involved in health policy at EU level, including EU officials, the EPHA website enhances public visibility of our member organisations and activities.

#### Support for advocacy work:

- ▶ Meetings of <u>Health Intergroup's Working Group on Public Health</u>. These meetings allow members to access and share their expertise with Members of the European Parliament, Commission officials and other authorities and health professionals stakeholders in public health.
- ▶ Access to EU decision makers and major players enhanced by the **Brussels expertise** of EPHA's Secretariat.
- Access to EPHA's comprehensive data base.

#### Representation and participation at European and international fora:

- Representation by an EPHA staff person, EPHA President or Executive Committee member at many working groups, conferences, and meetings organised by the **EU institutions**.
- Membership in the <u>Platform of European Social NGOs</u>.
- Co-operation with the World Health Organization.
- Ad hoc collaboration with **NGOs involved in the environmental sector, consumer affairs, transport** and so on, in areas affecting health.

#### Members' classification and fees

Around 100 local, national, regional and European non-governmental (NGOs) and not-for-profit organisations are members of the European Public Health Alliance (EPHA). EPHA membership organisations work individually and collectively to promote and protect the health interests of people living in Europe.

EPHA has two categories of membership:

• <u>FULL members</u> are Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) active in the public health sector. Full members have two votes at the Annual General Assembly.

▶ <u>ASSOCIATE members</u> are other not-for-profit organisations, professional bodies, academic institutions and local or regional authorities. Associate members have one vote at the Annual General Assembly (AGA).

**EPHA membership fees** are based on the income of the member organisation.

In 2009, the fees for new members are:

Annual income over 5,000,000 Euros 5,000 + 5,000 euros (1)

Annual income of 1,000,000 - 5,000,000 Euros 5.000 Euros

Annual income of 300,000 - 1,000,000 Euros 1,500 Euros

Annual income of under 300,000 Euros 800 Euros

(1) This extra 5.000 Euros corresponds to a mandatory contribution to the Mentor scheme for new members only. (please check the <u>Work Programme</u> for more details)

EPHA is aware that NGOs often have limited or ring-fenced funding therefore if you are interested in your organisation becoming a member of EPHA but would find the membership fee challenging to meet please indicate this in your application. EPHA will review reductions in fees on a case-by-case basis.
